4 Oral Manifestations of Liver Disease

- Oral candidiasis & Angular cheilitis (immunotherapy)
- Atrophic glossitis Anaemia
- Petechiae & Ecchymoses Thrombocytopenia/Interferon therapy
- Lichen planus –HCV
- Sjogren's syndrome –HCV
- Sialadenitis
- Some forms of oral cancers

Management (3 major issues)

- Risk of cross-infection,
- The risk of bleeding in patients with advanced liver disease,
- Alterations in the metabolism of certain drug substances which increases the risk of toxicity.

🕹 Drugs

- Be cautious with the drug used
- Avoid NSAIDs, Steroids
- Sedatives Barbiturates, benzodiazepines, opioids
- Antibiotics Erythromycin, Metronidazole, Tetracyclines

• Local anaesthetics -halothane, thiopentone
