Extra-Hepatic manifestations (EHM) are very common in Liver diseases (74%).

Extra Oral

- Alcoholic facies
- Yellowish discoloration
- Spider angiomas
- Xanthelasma
- Porphyria cutanea tarda
- Hemochromatosis

Intra Oral

- Oral lichen planus
- Reticular OLP
- Erosive OLP
- Sialo adenosis
- Xerostomia
- Dental caries
- Gingival periodontitis
- Glossitis
- Oral candidiasis
- Burning mouth syndrome
- Bruxism
- Hyperpigmentation
- Oral leucoplakia
- Poor oral Hygiene (75%) increased risk for liver cancer HCC (Oral & gut microbiome, diet / nutrition).
- Liver Transplant patients have 2.5times increased risk of cancer (oncogenic viruses EBV, CMV, HH8, HPV).
- 4 21% of H&N SCC had HCV infection.
